NEW SITE

Whilst there is a whole lot of work we can do at the new block we are still waiting for the lease to be registered. Once the lease has been registered then the plans approved by the ACT Government can be stamped. Once we have a set of stamped plans, these can be inspected and approved by the Certifier. The Committee has appointed a Certifier to perform the tasks required by the ACT Government.

Once all of the above processes have been performed then and only then can we start work on the new site. Once the processes imposed on us by the ACT Government are complete then we will be calling for volunteers so "watch this space".

Meanwhile we have purchased seven containers - two 40 foot high cubes and five 40 foot standard containers. These will be delivered over the next few weeks. This will give us storage space building tools, equipment etc.

Preliminary work is still being done marking out areas where infrastructure is to be located and the placement of the track layout.

MONEY MATTERS

May ticket sales were again down on the previous month with the mid month run producing \$602.00

while the postponement of the end of month run due to inclement weather produced \$0.00 in ticket sales.

Final results for May are still not good with a loss of \$1200.00 for the month. This was mainly due to the replacement of the windows in the toilet block which cost \$940.00. This amount still has to be claimed back through insurance. However the Club is still ahead. Low level of ticket sales continues to be a concern. By keeping the expenses at the KMR under control we should still have a favourable outcome at the end of the year.

COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee meetings held in June saw discussions mainly concentrated on the CMR site and the expenditure of the first of the Grant monies. Once the first grant amount has been spent and reconciled then we can receive the second instalment from the ACT Government. Expenditure of this money includes the Toilet block, containers, track steel and electronic components for signalling and control.
